CROSSCOUNTRY RACE AT DES MOINES

This was a 10K cross country race at the metro waste management facility east of Des Moines on Sept. 16th. It was termed a "green" race because of the extensive recycling, composting, and soil reclamation activity there. Most of the course was on grass or dirt, with a little on asphalt. It was quite hilly, with a lot of turns. The course was very well-marked with a wide chalk-mark over most of the course. There were also directional signs and a person at every questionable intersection .The race had 5-year age groups. I finished in 59:37, 32nd out of 39 finishers. There were two very fast runners out front, finishing in 33+ minutes, and only one second apart at the finish. Then there was about an 8 minute gap before the next runner arrived. I found this to be a very fun event.

COAL CREEK CROSS COUNTRY CHALLENGE October 14, 2007 By Bruce Kirschner

As the rain gods pounded the earth for the ninth annual staging of the Coal Creek Cross Country Challenge, the historically picture perfect fall weather for the event was just a faint memory. A relentless heavy rain fell all night and into the morning of the race. The club event that is typically the club's largest event of the year had one of the smallest fields since its inception. Although it attracted far fewer participants than expected, 67 hardy souls showed up to participate in the most challenging Challenge to date despite the inclement weather.

The incessant downpour had groomed the race course quite nicely, producing plenty of mud and a swelled Coal Creek for the runner's enjoyment. Loose dirt from trail rehabilitation work on the north side of the Empire Road crossing brought even more sludge. This year's planned "enhancement" was in the form of a little surprise: stacked hay bales strategically located just before the infamous ditch at the top of the hill south of Empire Road.

But perhaps the toughest part of the course was the short but steep hill just south of the Coal Creek crossing. According to race pace biker Roland Erickson, "The first few runners to cross the creek had an easier time making it up the hill, but everyone else who followed had to fight their way up it. People were trying to climb it on all fours, scratching their way up and over!"

Nolan Amy was the first male to manage his way to the finish line in 34:36. A University of Colorado senior majoring in Mechanical Engineering and member of the school's club triathlon team, Amy reported "I knew that the creek crossing existed, but didn't know where and ended up running a few yards beyond it. The hardest part of the course for me was the hay bales, even tougher than the ditch." Keith Johnson was a close second behind Amy in 34:41. Landon Punches, another CU student, finished third in 34:53.

Carrie Zografos, spouse to former CU runner Oscar Ponce, was first among the women in 38:19. A former CU sprinter and cross country runner, she is currently a nurse at Denver Health and a nursing instructor for Regis University. Carrie recently moved to Denver from her home state of Oregon after getting married to Oscar Ponce, former Denver North High School runner and member of Jeff Young's Planned Pethood Posse. Coincidentally, Ponce won and set a relay record in that morning's Denver Marathon Relay. According to Zografos, she "thought the [Coal Creek] race was great" and used it to prepare for the cross country nationals in December.

First time participant Liam Bierney of Boulder, who grew up as a cross country runner outside London, reported that "the weather today was just like home," and that "we need more cross country races [like this]. His only recommendation: have a "double creek crossing" next year(!).

A hearty thanks to all the volunteers who made this event possible. Scott McFarlane, Rosalia Murch and Tom Alison did a fine job with the registration. Jim Price lent his expert hand with finish line timing. Joe Baird, Tom Alison, and Dave Swanson deftly managed the finish line and scoring duties in adverse conditions. Fairview High School International Baccalaureate student, Yoshi Greer, volunteered to provide timing splits at the 1 mile point. Fellow Fairview IB student and friend Pratyush Dubey assisted with documenting runners in their order of finish (rain washed off key finish line tag info). Connie Ahrnsbrak dutifully transcribed all race results. Other volunteers along the course were Rollie Erickson (pace bike), Mark Bailey (ditch marshal), Randy Luallin (Empire Road crossing), Lori Dill (creek crossing), and Pete Wolfe (fence crossing). Sam Kirschner and Matt Menendez handled opening the livestock gates. Donna Luallin managed the water stop at the turnaround point.


