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FAIRMOUNT PARK 5K TRAIL RACE

The Fairmount 5K had a possibly record-breaking turnout of nearly 90 participants under hot, sunny skies. No rainclouds were in sight for a change, although a few mud puddles did find their way onto the course. Many of the age groups were fiercely competitive, with some very fast times run. Hector Martinez was the overall winner in a blazing 17:12 (exactly one minute faster than his 2007 time), and Patricia Martinez led the women's field in 22:50. Keith Johnson was the first masters (and second overall) in 18:23, and Pam Iyer led the masters women in 23:06 (second overall woman). We had 7 kids run in the new 13 and under age group, a good sign for the future of CMRA. Also of note, the Johnson family pulled off quite a sweep with fifteen year old son Keifer placing 3rd overall, 31 seconds behind his dad and mom Kathy placing third overall for women.

Pat Phillips gave a tribute at the start to Pat Hayes, long-time CMRA member who passed away last week after a long battle with cancer. His life will be celebrated at a party in October, rather than a memorial service, which was his preference. On a lighter note, Bruce Kirschner celebrated his 55th birthday the day of the race by winning his age category and sharing a large birthday cake with all of us after the race.

I would like to thank our previous race director, Pat Phillips, for his many years of service and for leading me step by step through the process of preparing for and directing the race. I hope that with all of his guidance, I will be able to pull this off myself next year. Thanks also to Joe Sanchez for bringing all the equipment, Adam Feerst for helping set the course, Rosalia Murch and Connie Ahrnsbrak for overseeing registration and Connie for tabulating the official results, Lucas Crespin and David Rothenburger for directing traffic at the first road crossing, Ray Sonheim for helping at the turnaround (and it sounds like doing quite a bit of traffic-directing himself), Julia Keedy and Sheri Mounteer for handing out water to all the thirsty runners at the water station, Joe Baird, Jim Price, Mike and Chris Vanoni and Ken Simons for doing the timing and directing the busy finishing line. I hope all of this year's participants will return and bring others, and I will do my best to make friends with the weather gods to keep up the favorable conditions.

ELK MEADOW TRAIL 10K RACE August 24, 2008 By Wayne Mathis

Elk Meadow's trails permit a runner to enjoy the natural beauty of the Colorado Mountains. The wildlife includes a large herd of Elk. Deer are often seen along the trails that gain in altitude ascending to Bergen peak. The trails run in this event include Painters Pause with an elevation gain of 260 feet, Sleepy 'S' and with a descent of 300 feet. The main trail is Meadow View with a gain of 230 feet, although a runner may feel the gain is much more on the north end of the trail as it turns to the west and gains altitude quickly. The park is located near Evergreen Colorado. Go west on Stagecoach Boulevard from the Evergreen Parkway. The trail head has a parking lot one mile west. Be sure to mark your calendars for next August if you missed this year's event.

The course record remains at 35.09. Andrew Adamowski ran a very fast 36.44. Kristen Moreau was the first female to cross the finish with an excellent time of 44:11. The record for females is 43:02.

Continue north through the traffic light on Dillon Road, go about a half mile and make your first left turn on to County Road (just before the railroad overpass). After coming down a short steep hill make your first left turn on to Bella Vista Drive and then your first right turn into the park and parking areas.

From Boulder, take South Boulder Road east to Main Street, Louisville. Make a right and head south about 1 mile to the 4-way stop at the intersection of Main Street and Pine Street (the Blue Parrot Restaurant is on the SE corner). Make a left onto Pine Street. Make the first right on to Front Street. Continue south about 1/4 mile and make a right turn into the Louisville Community Park and parking areas.

This race serves as the Road Runners Club of America 2008 Colorado State Championship cross country race! Runners can elect to run 1, 2, or 3 laps of this challenging, 4K (2 1/2 mile) loop. Championships are awarded for the 12K distance. The course includes single track trails that weave along creek bottom and fields and lawns bordering the soccer fields of the Aurora Sports Park soccer and softball complex.

From I-225, take 6th Avenue 4-1/2 miles east to Coal Creek Arena. From I-70, take Airport Blvd south 4 miles to 6th Avenue, then go east 2 miles to the arena. COLORADO MASTERS RUNNING / RACEWALKING ASSOCIATION

The CMRA is a non-profit group organized in 1976 to promote running and racewalking for health and exercise. The club regularly sponsors running-related activities, including 13 races a year, fun runs, training sessions, track workouts, and social events. Races are held at least once a month all over the greater Denver metro area. Races are as short as 5 kilometers (3.1 miles) and as long as 16.1 kilometers (10 miles). Age group awards and prize drawings are held following each race.

Membership in CMRA is open to all, regardless of skill or experience, although race awards are geared to runners age 35 and over. CMRA is an all-volunteer effort Races are conducted by CMRA members without monetary compensation. Members are expected to pitch in and help with club events! Annual dues are \$25 for individuals and \$35 for families based on a calendar year membership beginning in January. Since registration for club races are \$10 each for nonmembers and members race free, an individual CMRA membership pays for itself after just 3 races!

Aside from racing free each month, the CMRA newsletter, the *Master Times*, is issued every other month. Each issue includes recent race results, special articles about training and racing by club members, and information about future events.
