soon. I found that if I buy a more durable type with the shoe strings at REI and then discard the shoestrings and glue on Velcro patches, they work out pretty well.

I'd like thank you to Ken Simons for his work as President through the past 2-1/2 years. His low-key style, stable leadership, and approachability are qualities that I admire and will try to emulate.

Under Ken's leadership over the past couple of years, we've seen some exciting growth in the average number of runners at our races. Bruce Kirschner and Randy Luallin's CCCCC, the Coal Creek Cross Country Challenge, this race consistently registers more than 100 runners, with about 147 official finishers this year, which was at least for a month, a record turnout for CRMA. Bruce has worked hard and put in a lot of time and energy, working with the Boulder running community and the Colorado Race Series to promote and grow this race.

We've also registering over 100 runners for Kim Massey and Scott McFarlane's Chatfield trail race the past two years, and for this year's race which was co-sponsored by the Columbine's women's running club, the results were amazing: 289 official finishers.

The December edition of the Aurora Sports Park XC served as the Road Runners Club of America's 2008 Colorado State Championship cross country race. The RRCA provided commemorative wall plaques to first place finishers in open, masters and grand masters age groups for both men and women. CMRA board member Chris Vanoni serves as the RRCA's state representative. Race directors who may be interested in having their event designated an RRCA state championship are encouraged to contact Chris.

For the first race of 2009, Ken Randall's Lake Arbor 5K earlier this month drew in Ken's estimation its largest field ever, 96 finishers. Talking with some of our more experienced runners after the race, I came to understand that this venue is one of the CMRA's oldest, dating back to Seventies. The field for this year's race included a healthy mix of club members who have run it since its early years, several young children, and a pack of competitive speedsters running sub-six minute miles at the front of the pack.

I will certainly look to keep the club growing and moving forward with these and other initiatives, probably some new venues, more to come on this, and look to lean on Ken's expertise. I've enjoyed working with all of you on the board of the Colorado Masters Running Association over the past two years. It has been fun. I look forward to continuing the fun over the next year or two as president of the club.

I'd like to recognize Keith and Kathy Johnson for taking over (at least for the next few issues) full responsibility for editing this newsletter. Their gracious support of the club is much appreciated. If you or someone you know is interested in helping Keith and Kathy with the newsletter, please contact one of our board members.

Race Results

Aurora Sports Park XC December 6, 2008

The 12K distance of the December edition of this Colorado Masters Running Association race served as the Road Runners Club of America state championship for cross country. 70 hardy runners came to play in the fields around Aurora Sports Park and the surrounding open space, none speedier than 26 year-old Boulder steeplechase specialist Robert Mandje, who also won the October Colorado Masters race. Unlike the relatively close finish of the Coal Creek Cross Country Challenge, Robert built and maintained a lead to the finish. A professional runner coached by former marathon great Lorraine Moller, Robert claimed the Open Championship in a blazing 43:14 (5:48 per mile) on this challenging course. Jitka O'Farrell, 31, claimed the women's open title with a time of 57:29 (7:43). The 2008 Masters (40+) winner is Keith Johnson, 47, with a time of 47:32 (6:23). The Grand Masters (50+) title went to Greg Ayres, 50, in a time of 61:08 (8:12). There were no women competitors in the masters and grand masters age groups.

This edition of the race again featured 3 laps of a 4 kilometer (about 2-1/2 miles) loop. The race course started and finished at Coal Creek Rodeo Arena off 6th Avenue in eastern Aurora. About half of the course was run on the beautiful green lawns bordering the soccer fields of Aurora Sports Park. The other sections of the course included a variety of surfaces: sandy, single track trails, a dirt road, short stretches of gravel and asphalt paths, and open fields. The most unique portion was a 100 meter-long narrow, winding "tunnel" through willow brush. Most challenging to runners was an icy creek crossing. Most competitors avoided getting their feet wet by working their way over fallen logs that bridged the cold water. A few brave harriers chose to save time by splashing through the murky foot-deep pool at the crossing.

At the 9:00 am start the sandy trail sections, rutted by horse hooves, were frozen into ankle busting ridges and portions of the lawns were crusty. By the time the 12K race was over the trails and lawns grew soggy with melting snow. Despite the challenges, our youngest competitor, 7 year-old Kathryn Stone was the first female finisher, completing the 4K distance running with her father Chris Stone in an amazing 23:33. The oldest competitor in the field, Ken Green, age 79, impressed and brought a rousing cheer from the finish line crowd by completing the full 12K distance with a time of 94:27.

It took a tremendous effort by a great number of people to put this event together. Along with race co-director Rob Fisher, I'd like to thank all the volunteers who made this event possible, including; Joe Sanchez (equipment, water and soda); Tom Alison (awards coordinator); Vici DeHaan (prize coordinator and course marshal); Joe Baird (timing); Connie Ahrnsbrak (registration), Rosalia Murch (registration); Mike Vanoni (scoring); Chris Vanoni (RRCA awards and banners); Ken Simon (course marshal and insurance); and Ashley Birger (photos). Special thanks to my wife Lu and sons Joey and Sam for their assistance in course set-up, tear down, and marshaling. Also, I'd like to extend special thanks to the City of Aurora for permitting the event, including Ranger Justin Clark with Aurora Open Space and Manager Dan Adams with Aurora Sports Park.
